Dear Parent or Guardian:

Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Company have been authorized to distribute student insurance materials and applications for the 2007-2008 school year. Participation in this program is optional. However, participation in school athletic programs requires medical insurance coverage. Please keep in mind that Highline School District does not provide medical insurance coverage for school accidents. And in the event of an accident at school, you would be responsible for the medical bills.

The following points are listed for your information and consideration.

### Enrollment

To enroll for student accident insurance, complete the Enrollment Application Form, make checks or money orders payable to Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc. or complete the MasterCard/Visa payment form. Send form and payment directly to Myers-Stevens in the enclosed envelope.

### Coverage

Coverage begins upon receipt of the form and premium at Myers-Stevens. Any benefits awarded will be coordinated with other insurance carried by the family. As this policy does not provide unlimited coverage, it is important to read the accompanying brochure carefully. This insurance is highly recommended for students without other insurance.

### Claims

Any injury must be reported to the school immediately. Claim forms are available in the school office and must be completed by the school and parent and sent to Myers-Stevens within 90 days of the first medical visit.

### Athletics-Intramural

Purchase of coverage is requested if your child plans to participate in the Intramural Program and does not have private insurance. Even with private insurance coverage, Myers-Stevens would cover most deductibles and uninsured costs. Since the district does not carry insurance to cover medical costs of injury resulting from participation in interscholastic activities, all participants in middle or high school sports are required to enroll in the above plan or have a properly signed activity/participation form on file in the school office confirming the existence of private insurance coverage.

In addition, based on family income, Medicaid may provide free health insurance for eligible children under the age of 19. For eligibility requirements or additional information on the Medicaid plan, call the Community Health Access Program at 206.284.0331 or 1.800.756.5437.
