MASTER ARTIST WORKSHOP

Lauren Kearns

This workshop will cover how to trim, alter and cut forms, carve designs and ways to use stains and underglazes for decoration. Participants will learn about the use of stains and underglazes for high fire oxidation decoration. Participants will be asked to bring in images that they would like to work from as a source of inspiration. Other techniques for decoration will be discussed such as slip trailing and colored slips. Students are encouraged to bring in bisque test tiles. Lots of information will be shared on materials and decorative techniques with color. All supplies provided. Please bring a lunch.

Lauren Kearns is currently the director of the Carbondale Clay Center in Carbondale, CO. She has vast experience as both an exhibiting artist and an instructor. She studied at the Kansas City Art Institute and received her MFA from the University of Oregon, Eugene. She has been a resident at the Archie Bray Foundation and worked at Peter Volkos' Macaroni Factory. She has sold her work in both wholesale and retail venues and taught at art centers and colleges around Puget Sound.

From Hwy 518 W. take a left at 1st Ave S. Take a second left at S 156th and go over bridge. Take a third left at 4th PL. (at flashing crosswalk sign.) Moshier is the first building on your right with the bright yellow doors.

To Burien Community Center:

425 S 144th, Burien

(Parks and Recreation Office)

From Hwy 518 W. continue west on 148th. Take a right on 4th Ave SW. Take a left on SW. 144th St. Our building is on the corner.

INSTRUCTORS

Linda Conroy: A traditional herbalist and whole and wild foods enthusiast. Linda offers programs throughout the country and was recently featured in Cooking Light magazine for the "Eat Wild: Community Meals" she hosts at her home in Sheboygan, WI.

Janet Crawley: Masters in Education with 13 years teaching art for K-12 in Kansas and Missouri. Janet currently focuses on handbuilding as a studio potter at Moshier and has shown her work in the Midwest and Seattle area. A Moshier instructor since 2005.

Pam Fredback: A studio artist at Moshier since 2003, Pam works for the Kent School District and has experience teaching children's art classes. She exhibits her work locally.

Vicki Hamilton: California College of Arts and Crafts. A Moshier instructor since 2003. Vicki's work has been exhibited at the Snohomish Arts Council, the Edmonds Arts Festival and Local Color Café and Gallery. Her work has been sold in Issaquah, Woodinville, West Seattle and Burien since 2001.

John Holzwart: John is a maker of 100% handcrafted brooms. He teaches his craft across the US.

Lauren Laughlin: BA, Univ of the Redlands. A Moshier instructor since 2005. Lauren has shown at the Kirkland Art Center and Design Within Reach. She also teaches at Seward Park and the Kirkland Art Center.

Michael Lowe: MFA Boston Univ. A Moshier instructor since 2000, Michael has work in the permanent collection of the Brooklyn Museum and Carnegie Mellon Institute, among others.

Hunter McGee: MFA, UW. A Moshier instructor since 1996, Hunter's work has been exhibited at the Kirkland Art Center and Bellevue Art Museum.

Ellen Miffitt: MS Art Education, Central Connecticut Univ. Ellen has been an artist-in-resident at the Tacoma Museum of Glass as well as a teacher for South Puget Sound Community College and other location in the south Sound. She exhibits her work widely around Washington State.

Shariana Mundi: MA, Antioch Univ., A Moshier instructor since 2000, Shariana teaches art classes for students with disabilities in Kent and has coordinated children's arts activities for local festivals including Seattle Center's Winterfest and Whirligig.

Dan Parker: LEGO Certified Professional. Dan is one of only 3 artists in this capacity in the country recognized by the Lego Company. Dan has produced commissioned works for national and international clients, mounted hundreds of shows, and facilitates a variety of youth programs throughout the area.

Delores Taylor: A Moshier instructor since 2006. Delores is an artist and educator working in kilnformed art glass. She has taught at Pratt Fine Arts, Arrowmont School of Crafts, and the Corning Museum of Glass. Her work is exhibited within the US and Europe.

Ken Turner: A Moshier instructor since 1994, Ken has maintained a private studio since 1983. He has exhibited widely at such venues as the Bellevue Art Museum, Northwest Craft Center and the Pacific Northwest Arts Fair. Ken is represented by numerous galleries around the country and also teaches classes for Bellevue Community College.
