What it is:

The State's Basic Food Program helps low-income individuals and families obtain a more nutritious diet by supplementing their income with food assistance benefits.

Who is eligible:

Individuals who reside in Washington State must meet the following:

Income Requirements

Citizen Requirements

(includes U.S. citizens & lawfully admitted residents who meet the 5 year residency requirement & some non-citizens)

Agree to participate in Food Assistance work and training program

Income

Gross income means a household's total before any deductions have been made.

Photo Identification

Social Security Card

Immigration & Naturalization documentation (Not required if client is not applying for food assistance but are applying for their children who were born in the United States)
