Centered on Glaze

You don't have to have a PhD in chemistry to work with glazes. This workshop is for the ceramics artist with little background in glaze development but who is interested in creating a unique look using common studio glazes. The instructor will provide very basic "need to know" information on glaze formulation and raw materials. Learn about glaze mixing, blending and testing and a variety of application techniques. Cane and Paper Lanterns

Illuminate yourself during these dark days of winter! This three day workshop will introduce the beautiful and elegant art of paper lanterns. This project allows magnificent shaping with cane to form the internal structure of a bird lantern. This is an intermediate level skill technique which requires the use of a staple gun, hot glue and wire, as well as basic paper mache' (all materials and tools will be provided) Other examples of the technique and lighting options will be provided in the workshop. Three days will be required to complete your lantern, so please plan to attend all three sessions. \$20 materials fee to be paid to the instructor. Instructor: Leslie Zenz
