



Do you know an exceptional science teacher?

The annual **Amgen Award for Science Teaching Excellence** (AASTE) program is looking for extraordinary science teachers from across the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico.

This year, **32 science teachers** will be awarded an unrestricted cash grant of \$5,000, and their schools will receive a restricted grant of \$5,000 to be used to expand or enhance the school's science program, purchase new science resources, or further the professional development of their science teachers.

To be eligible, nominees must:

- ❑ Be full-time, K-12 classroom teachers whose major responsibilities include teaching science
- ❑ Have at least three years of experience teaching science in grades K–12
- ❑ Work in communities where Amgen has key operating sites: California, Colorado, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Washington, Puerto Rico, and Canada (British Columbia and Ontario).
